Some of these services offer convincing arguments that they are legal. Accept them if they'll sign that they'll do your jail sentence or pay your fine should you be convicted of copyright infringement.

Legal sources of music:

- iTunes, at www.apple.com/itunes/ —for Mac and Windows, sells thousands of CD titles and also sells songs individually. Yes, you have to pay for them, but not much!!!
- Rhapsody, at music.real.com — subscription service that lets you listen to your customized music from any computer and burn music at a per-song fee
- Moontaxi, at www.moontaxi.com — 5 free Internet radio stations, \$19.95 a year for over a hundred stations, fees for CD purchase and download
